

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

Reaction to the Workshop: Hey Bryce, I just wanted to say thanks for taking the time to help out our modern language department and the Latin teachers too. Everyone had such great things to say, especially the lower school and EC teachers who I think felt left out of a lot of trainings in previous years. We had lots of very interesting discussions and it all made for a productive and positive day. I appreciated it so much, as well as your kind words about me. I had a whole page of takeaways myself about some positive changes to make next year even more successful.

For one, I've always kept a pretty rigid hand on *Persona Especial*. Not that I wouldn't ask follow-up questions, but I never went that far with it. I liked the idea of sheltering less grammar with it and including present perfect structures especially. Last year I started making yearbook-style pages like you showed us, but I like the tweaks you have created, and I think it'd be fun to do it more than once throughout the year to add to it as kids get to know each other and acquire more Spanish. And constructing the Yo form sentences alongside it is also genius. I'm going to pick up some sets of your <u>Hi-Impact Reading Strategies</u> book for my department. I also enjoyed learning about Ikigai, which is a new concept for me, I think can make for some great talks / additions to *persona especial* with my level 2 and honors classes.

I think my biggest takeaway was that I have been doing this for long enough now that I have kind of forgotten where I learned a lot of techniques, and it struck me that a huge percentage of what my class looks like comes directly from your teachings. I'm just very thankful!





This one is called <u>¿Qué pasó con el jersey?</u> (Spanish level 1) It is the same beautiful story, but now in the past tense. This is a perfect segue for level 1 Spanish students to understand the past tense.

QUESTIONS

Ask questions, listen, and ask follow-up questions. Questions to get going:

> How is everyone? What issues you are dealing with? How are the students? What do you want to talk about? What do we need to follow up on?

Teacher answers, concerns and questions:

"Some students have forgotten what it's like to be in school."
"Some students want to translate aloud as they read."
"Kids are spent."
"Some kids don't want to have to think."
"Kids have checked out."
"Everyone is tired."
"Vocabulary: Some students do not get all of it. Do I just let it go? Do I need to teach every single word?"
"I can't get kids to keep reading."

VOCABULARY

Every lesson has core vocabulary. Students need that, plus the vocabulary that will be in the final assessment for the unit. There is also additional vocabulary in each lesson that is not repeated in upcoming lessons.

It is important to use high frequency vocabulary. The more awareness of word frequency that you have, the better. Sources for word frequency:

<u>Important Words</u> (*Palabras Importantes*, high-frequency function words) <u>Important Verbs</u> This is a compilation of the top verbs that students need in order to listen and read, and that teachers need to use and teach to run the class in the TL instead of breaking into English.



<u>Wikitionary</u> another good source for word frequency lists. Wiktionary is compiled from subtitles of all media types. It gives all forms of verbs by frequency, not just the infinitives so you can get an idea of which tenses, moods and conjugations are the most valuable.

<u>A Frequency Dictionary of Spanish</u>, by Mark Davies. Also available in French and other languages. Compiled from written sources. Lists verbs by infinitives.

READING

Over the past 3 years, I have learned so much from Bryce Hedstrom. He has taught me loads of teaching techniques, resources, language theory, and classroom management techniques to meet language learners at various levels of language acquisition. Some include Special Person Interviews, Monday & Friday past & future tense discussion questions, voluntary student reading, group reading, reading resources, TPR, StoryLabs, Krashen's MANIAC theories, timed writing techniques, reading reports, exit tickets, and so much more! "Interesting & Comprehensible" are plastered into my brain as the keys to reading comprehension, student engagement, and language acquisition. It only makes sense that these are the two words I would use to describe Bryce Hedstrom as well.

What did you like about the PD?



What I liked most about the PD was Bryce's personality and approach to teaching. He is an educator who engages all learners at their individual levels of interest and comprehension. I learned so much about learning languages from this experience. I really appreciated that the PD was directly connected to language acquisition, which transfers across learning Spanish, French, and English in a variety of ways. This PD has been more helpful to my ELL techniques than any other PD I've ever been part of. I can't express enough how having this PD rolled out in an ongoing manner really helped me grasp onto the ideas, have time to implement many of the techniques and strategies, and then follow up with questions or take things to the next level with the next round of PD. Oftentimes, it seems that PD is a one-and-done session that doesn't have lasting power for influence. As learners, we need to hear information more than once and really have the opportunity to take learning into our own hands, mess around with it, and bring it back for review, revision, and reflection before any really deep learning takes place. PD with Bryce Hedstrom provided this.

What would you suggest changing?

I think the biggest need for me and my world language coworkers is just time to implement some of these ideas. I would benefit from structured time to sift through the materials and resources more that Bryce provided us with. I liked having Bryce come to FDSH in person several times, but also understand that Zoom is much more convenient for ongoing meetings across different states. However, I would always prefer face-to-face interactions over Zoom.

What did you learn?

I learned quite a few teaching strategies that I could implement immediately into my classroom. Having not been a part of the original PD years ago, there were several new ideas for me: Special Person Interviews, reading strategies and expectations, grammar suggestions, circling techniques, etc. There were also several strategies that I've used before that this professional learning either challenged my thinking, tweaked my instruction, or affirmed what I'm doing. These topics include TPR, teaching and practicing vocabulary using high frequency verbs, and using rejoinders (although I didn't use this term in the past. I also appreciated the feedback on my own teaching.

What did you like about the PD?

I REALLY appreciate having PD specifically for world language. Many teaching strategies and philosophies still apply to our department, but it truly looks different in a foreign language classroom. For example, I understand how differentiation is so important in all classes, but it was interesting to discuss how circling can easily be a form of differentiation. It was helpful that this was a small group, and Bryce was very adaptable at providing learning and facilitating discussion according to our needs.

What would you suggest changing?

I actually thought the Zooms in our own classrooms were okay. Using 2 computers, I could Zoom with the group and still easily look up books, websites, materials on the other computer as Bryce walked us through them. There were so many ideas that we discussed, the only drawback was then finding additional time outside of PD to revamp lessons and even units. I wouldn't want to shorten our time together, but if we had 4 hours of learning and 1 hour for application, or 3 hours of learning and 1 hour for application - that would be helpful from a planning standpoint.



MY RESPONSE:











Instructional time must be protected from distractions that are outside of the curriculum.

A world language curriculum should be focused on language and culture. We are trying to woo students into loving the language and culture. In order to persuade students to love and engage with the culture and language, it is best to emphasize positive aspects. Of course, we want students to be aware of current and historical issues, but we mostly want them to associate satisfying feelings with the language and people rather than resentment and despair. Positive emotions will compel students to stick with their studies for years—hopefully for the rest of their lives. A world language classroom should emphasize "Big C" (recognized world-class historical achievements) and "Little C" (daily life of the common people) cultural elements and guide students into thinking how those practices compare and contrast with their LI language and civilization.

Here are some cultural topics to emphasize in a well-rounded world language class:

THE STORIES

• **Cultural Stories:** Folk tales, legends, and myths from the culture that illustrate thinking and morays. Learning a language is more than vocabulary and grammar. Authentic cultural stories help learners to communicate more clearly. Students need to know cultural stories to understand the metaphor-laden speech that every native speaker uses. (Native speakers use <u>cultural metaphors six times per minute</u>, according to Kendall Haven, author of *Storyproof*. Even urban legends from the culture.

• Folk Wisdom: Cultural sayings. This is a practical topic to share with students because the insight and wisdom can help them the rest of their lives.

THE PLACES

• **Geography:** The target language world: countries, capitals, cities, rivers, climates, economies, and people.

• Wonders: Natural features and those made by human hands.

THE CULTURAL ACHIEVMENTS

• **Literature:** Noteworthy literature and authors; both classic and popular literature. What has the culture produced? What are people reading now?

• **Music:** Enduring professional and folk music. Modern music. Performers. Genres of music. Musical instruments. Musical celebrations. Venues.

• Dance: Folk dance. Modern dance. Performers. Venues. Types of dances.

- **Sports:** Sports teams, athletes, sports venues, competitions.
- Media: Noteworthy films, genres, shows, actors, directors, content creators.

• **Art:** Fine art and folk art. Classic and modern art, from paintings and sculpture to graffiti.

• Architecture: Classic and modern architecture from the culture.

THE PEOPLE



• **Food:** What to expect and what to try: not-to-be-missed cultural foods, recipes, food preparation, where to find cultural foods, plus mealtime and restaurant etiquette.

• **Spirituality:** The deeply held beliefs that have historically influenced the life and thinking of speakers and the cultural implications of these beliefs. Modern beliefs.

• **Celebrations:** Meaningful cultural celebrations, both religious and secular—their significance and interpretations.

• **Daily Life:** What to expect when you travel or live there: predictable actions and reactions of the people. This is a broad area and can include hundreds of tips and insights that will greatly benefit students.

• **Body Language:** The predictable gestures and facial expressions that students will encounter when dealing with native speakers. Many of these will be absorbed by students if the teacher uses these regularly in the classroom. This is part of not just talking about culture, but <u>immersing</u> students in it.

• **Fun Stuff:** Like <u>Tongue Twisters</u> and <u>Children's Rhymes and Chants</u> from the culture.





Seal of Biliteracy was approved in the state of Colorado. Delegated to former CCFLT presidents. Got their photos with state legislators and stories on state-wide television programs.

• CCFLT BOARD Expanded CCFLT board to get more help and lighten the workload.

• Personally asked energetic, competent and already busy teachers (the kind that get things done) to serve on the CCFLT board.

• Delegated specific duties to board members. Gave them freedom to do the job, responsibility for doing it, and a budget to implement their duties.

 Permitted and Encouraged board members to recruit teachers to help them with their duties go lighten their load.



INCREASED REVENUE

Increased revenue for the organization from a \$70,000 **net loss in the previous 3 years** to a \$65,000 **net gain** in one year: a \$135,000 increase in revenue in one year.

• INCREASED MEMBERSHIP Increased membership in the organization by 20% in one year, after years of decline.

CONFERENCES

Organized 2 conferences, each with popular and internationally known keynote speakers. Was heavily involved in the organization of 8 other CCFLT conferences.

Increased attendance at both annual conferences: Fall conference +50%. Spring conference +20%.

Delegated all predictable conference duties to board members so that I, as CCFLT president, could meet, greet, and listen to members. That accessibility made attendees feel noticed.

Personally invited World Language "Super Star" presenters with wide-ranging appeal to be the keynote speakers at both the Fall and Spring conferences.

Personally invited other well-known World Language presenters to be at both the Fall and Spring conferences.

NEW MEMBER RAFFLE

Instituted raffle for new members: Donated the CCFLT president's penthouse suite to the winning new member of CCFLT. Young teachers had parties there and invited their friends—very appealing to young teachers.

• BOOKKEEPING

Established processes for bookkeeping and budgeting to keep track of CCFLT funds.

Restructured organization financially and brought it out of debt for the first time in 8 years.

Left the organization with a substantial financial surplus (\$65,000) and a model of fiscal responsibility going forward.

MINI-CONFERENCES

Established the "Mini Conference" program to offer professional development for CCFLT members outside of the Denver metro area. These were free one-day workshops in farflung areas of the state. They were facilitated by volunteer CCFLT board members to help and encourage teachers in isolated areas of the state. Mini conferences were held in:

Grand Junction (far western Colorado) Glenwood Springs (mountain central Colorado) Colorado Springs (south-central Colorado) Pueblo (southern Colorado) Johnstown (northern Colorado)

Attendance at the mini-conferences was free for CCFLT members. Attendees could also register and become members at the door of the mini conference. Goal was to recruit new members and reach out to inactive members. Made personal phone calls to teacher leaders and department heads of world language teachers in the area of scheduled mini conferences.



This was huge success because it brought back CCFLT members outside of the Denver metro area who had felt neglected and ignored for many years.

AWARD SPONSORSHIPS:

Started exhibitor/donor sponsorships of awards. This provided revenue for the organization and advertising for the donating exhibitors. Win/Win.

• EXHIBITS & VENDORS

Delegated exhibits to an organized, creative, and energetic teacher.

Actively sought out and invited new vendors to exhibit at conferences to give attendees access to materials to enrich instruction and provide a recreational shopping experience and expose them to helpful and interesting new products: Textbook publishers, novellas, travel companies, multimedia materials, classroom decorations, realia, knickknacks, jewelry, CIA, Air Force Academy, state university language programs, National Parks,

Started "Vendor Bucks" program to seed purchases with exhibitors. Each attendee was given a voucher that could be spent as cash with conference exhibitors. This was very popular with exhibitors.

SOCIAL MEDIA CONTESTS

Began social media re-tweet competition at the conference to engage tech-savvy teachers more. Teachers that re-tweeted the most during the conference were recognized and rewarded.

SELFIE STATION

Started the popular 'Selfie Station' for attendees <u>to get photos with presenters</u>. Celebrity presenters were asked to appear at scheduled times to get selfies taken with adoring fans.

FIRESIDE CHATS



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This was the year that turned it around for me and got me focused on teaching, rather than odd jobs like painting houses, cleaning carpets, cleaning offices, and coaching. I was complaining to my principal, **Gene Labriola**, how tired I was. I had been teaching all day, coaching for 3 hours every afternoon, and then cleaning carpets at night. I was physically and mentally exhausted. He asked me if I had a college degree and if there was any part time work where I could use my brain more than my body. I took his wise-cracking advice to heart and applied to teach Conversational Spanish at the local community college.
